"Sarumawashi", which literally translates to "monkey dancing," has evolved over a 1000-year history in Japan. Acrobatic stunts and comedic skits are performed by highly trained Macaque monkeys. The monkey and trainer perform as one unit to demonstrate a bond between man and primate. Despite its popularity as festival entertainment over the centuries, Sarumawashi almost perished in the 1970's due to urbanization. In 1977 the Suo Sarumawashi Association was created in the Yamaguchi Prefecture to preserve the tradition of this highly regarded performing art.
