Photographs by Hiroshi Watanabe exhibit first time at *The Center for Friends Without A Border*, Siem Reap, Cambodia. His colorful photographs from North Korea tell an unbiased story of culture and every day life. The artist made the trip to investigate the many stories he had heard of people starving and dying in the streets; of police brutality; and of the lack of outside information and education.

Seeking to capture traditions, people, and locales of personal interest, Watanabe immerses himself in study before departure but makes a concerted effort to travel without preconceived ideas. His vision of the unity of the world is the thread that connects his work.

The artist's work has been widely exhibited in galleries across the United States and Japan.
